he 3rd Session of the 6th Synod Thanksgiving service of the Diocese of Lagos Mainland was held on Sunday, May 26 2024 at St. Stephen's Anglican Church, Igbobi. The service started with the opening of the Choir Office by the Rt. Revd Jacob Kwashi, the Bishop of the Diocese of Zonkwa at 11:00 am. It was a sung Eucharistic service which started with the following Processional Hymns: Holy, Holy, Holy! Lord God Almighty, God is here as we his People, Father in whom we live.



The matching followed this in of the Color Party performance by the Diocesan Anglican Communion Brigades and "Father, Lord of Earth and Heaven" was sung as Invocation.

The Dean of the Cathedral Church of St. Jude, Ebute-Meta, the Ven. Olusegun Ajayi was the Celebrant.

The Old Testament Reader was the Registrar of the Diocese who also doubled as the Chairperson of the Synod Planning Committee, Lady Chikwe Ochiagha who read Ecclesiastes 1:1-18; the Epistler was the Assistant Registrar, Bar, Bayo Fakunle who read 1 Peter 2:9-12 while the Gospeler was the Rt. Revd Samuel Sowale, the retired Bishop of the Diocese of Ilesa read Matthew 16:24-28.

The Preacher was the Rt. Revd Stanley Fube, the Bishop of the Diocese of Langtang. The theme was "Eternity in View" with the text taken from 1 Peter 2:11-12.

The Preacher appreciated the Diocesan Bishop/President of the Synod for the opportunity to preach at the Synod and he also saluted the host Church.

e introduced the sermon telling us that the only deception one can do is to think that one will live in this world forever. He said, "We have come here to buy and sell, and when the market closes, we shall all go home".

Our understanding of this will help us to shape what we do and how we do it". He referred us to Philippians 3 where Paul said that our citizenship is in heaven.

The Preacher told us that being a child of God is not by position but by confession. He also quoted John Newton who said "I once was lost but now I am found." We were also told not to judge anyone by their past but we are to allow God to do his work in people's life.

- 1. Brevity of life.
- 2. There is a time for accountability for every action.
- 3. Everything is passing away.
- 4. It gives meaning to life because life is temporary.

How do we keep eternity in view?

- 1. Setting our priorities right.
- 2. Guard up your loins against temptation. It helps you to know that you have a destination.
- We should consider that our present sufferings are not worthy to be compared with the glory which shall be revealed in us (Romans 8:18).
- 4. Being mission-minded having a passion for souls.
